

Introduction

The NHM PIP facilitates States/ UTs to implement many activities, process, innovations /best practices etc to achieve mandated targets. Important example of activities in PIP are Planning & Mapping, Program Management Structures, Creation of service delivery infrastructure, Outreach services, Community Processes , Public Private Partnerships, Inter-sectoral coordination and cooperation among Urban Local Bodies, Convergence of services, Innovations/Best practices, Quality Assurance, Capacity Development (Trainings), Monitoring and Evaluation etc. The State PIP spells out the key strategies, activities undertaken, budgetary requirements and key health outputs and outcomes at district and below levels. However, outcomes and impact of various services/ activities under the NHM depends on much broader social, cultural, economic and administrative context, which are interrelated and influences the already complex and dynamic health system.

Many programmes, schemes and activities, innovations, best practices under NHM have in-build mechanism of evaluation for further expansion, rollout, modifications etc. These need to be assessed and evaluated time to time as mandated in the PIP for their performance in terms of process, outputs, outcomes, impact, equity, cost benefit and cost effectiveness, quality and coverage etc.

The assessment/appraisal/evaluation of on-going activities will require strengthening capacity among health administrators, programme managers and consultants at various levels to design and develop Evaluation Research proposal on 'new schemes, innovative strategies, policies, process etc under the NHM. Strengthening evaluation capacity would require focusing on preparation of concept note, developing objectives and objective-wise Indicators, type of evaluation required as per the terms of reference of evaluation, evaluation methodology, developing tools and techniques of evaluation, analysis and report writing etc. Based upon feedback from State NHM Official under who have attended various courses at NIHFw, it is

proposed to organize five days workshop from 12-16 December, 2022. There would be two phases of this workshop. During the first phase, state officials would be able to develop 'Evaluation Research' proposal. For this purpose, they are expected to come prepared with the topic and scope of evaluation as decided by the State NHM authorities. After the third workshop, trained participants would be supported through email by the course team for conducting, supervising the process of evaluation and managing evaluation of scheme/activities under NHM and preparation of the report etc.

General Objective

To enhance the competence of State/District level officials in developing Innovative Schemes/ Programmes & its Evaluation in NHM

At the end of training participants should be able to:

- Define Evaluation and Conceptual Framework relating to Evaluation.
- Describe various types of Evaluation
- Develop evaluation methodology for designing Innovative Schemes/ Programmes & its Evaluation in NHM
- Developing time line and budget for Evaluation Research
- Preparing outlines of the evaluation report
- Develop Evaluation Research proposal relating to Innovative Schemes/ Programmes during the workshop

The workshop is expected to equip state NHM officials at various levels who are involved in planning, implementation and evaluation to undertake concurrent/final evaluation of NHM schemes/activities/processes in the state.

The workshop will also enhance the competence of State level officials to organise similar evaluation workshops for capacity building among district level NHM officials in the state.

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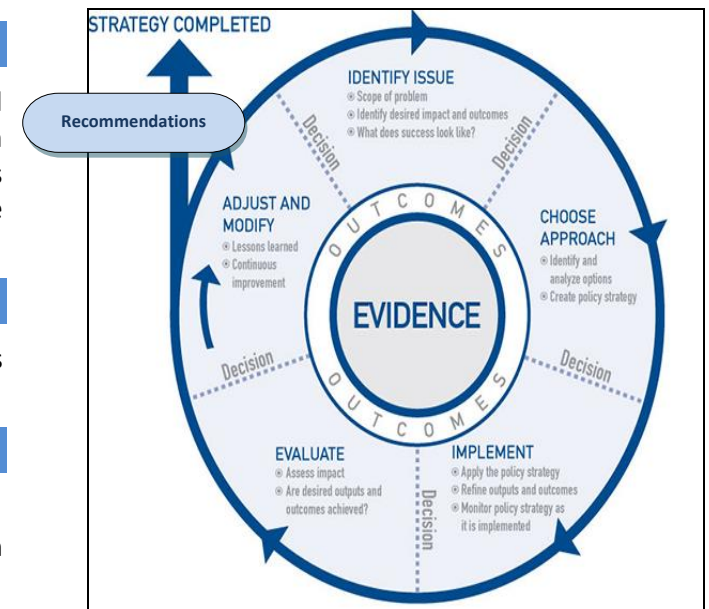
